Registration Stages for Competitors

This is a four stage overview which outlines the key stages to the registration process. This is really important for us to collect as much information as we can to aid planning. Stage 1 is **the pre-registration stage**, this requires no financial commitment but will assist us. Stage 2 - event registration opens on February 1st 2024. Its vital that competitors and team leaders follow this process for overflight exemptions and planning purposes. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and efforts in helping us.

We plan to produce a number of 'local procedure' documents which will aid competitors; for example departure and arrival routes and known start gates will be pre-published to ensure competitors can safely and accurately identify these essential parts of a navigation task.
