A Large Former World War 2 site situated in the East Midlands.

The Longest Runway is (020/220) 1200m and is tarmac with a grass Runway alongside. There is plenty of space. We intend to run multiple decks for take offs and landings.

There are excellent power and utilities already in place. The Airfield has already hosted several large events, and this includes the British Hang Glider Aerotow championship which it successfully ran in 2022 and is again hosting in 2023 with 50+ pilots flying and operating in a safe environment for a 10-day period.


The site successfully hosted the test event 'Grande Open' in July 2023





- Live band and meal at social event on final evening





















